Get FOCUSEd!"

Makes a Positive Financial Impact by Reducing Absences

This case study highlights one of the many benefits of the Get Focused...Stay Focused!® (GFSF) program to schools.

Schools implementing GFSF programs see **decreased suspensions**, **increased a-g completions**, and **higher graduation rates**. It's difficult to tie a direct financial cost to each of these issues. However, GFSF schools also see a **significant reduction in absences**, and that is easily measurable in dollars in the form of ADA (or Average Daily Attendance).

Data from GFSF schools in Carpinteria and Bakersfield indicates they realized a 13% to 15% reduction in absences. The Mount Everest High School case study below uses a conservative 10% reduction in absences to demonstrate the potential financial impact.

- ✓ Mount Everest High School has 1,000 students (250 students per grade).
- ✓ The first year of the GFSF program at Mount Everest, only the freshmen are impacted.
- ✓ Assuming a 6% daily absence rate, 15 freshmen are absent each day, or 2,700 absences yearly.
- ✓ With an ADA rate of \$50, those 2,700 absences represents a loss of \$135,000 each year.
- ✓ By reducing absences by just 10%, the school adds \$13,500 in ADA income.
- ✓ Assuming this trend continues as each new freshman class is impacted by GFSF, the cash flow looks like this:

Material costs for Year 1 include the Get Focused course text Career Choices & Changes (for dual enrollment) and a student workbook with seat license. Approximate per-student cost is \$65 including tax, shipping, etc.

Material costs for Years 2, 3, and 4 include a student workbook with seat license for each incoming freshman and Stay Focused course module for each advancing upperclassman.

The ADA rate varies, so the \$50 figure may be higher or lower in some areas. The reduction in absences that a school realizes also varies. However, even a 5% reduction in absences will result in a gain in ADA that will more than cover the material costs of the GFSF program.
